- 4. 拼写与标点符号是语言准确性的一个方面,评分时,应视其对交际的影响程度 予以考虑。英、美拼写及词汇用法均可接受。
 - 5. 如书写较差,以至影响交际,将分数降低一个档次。

第四档 (12-15分)

完全完成了试题规定的任务。

- 有效地使用了语句间的连接成分,使全文结构紧凑。完全达到了预期的写作目的。

第三档 (9-11分)

完全完成了试题规定的任务。

- 虽漏掉 1、2 个重要内容,但覆盖大部分主要内容。
- 应用的语法结构和词汇能满足任务的要求。
- 语法结构或词汇方面应用基本准确,些许错误主要是因尝试较复杂语法结构或词汇 所致。
 - 应用简单的语句间连接成分,使全文结构紧凑。 达到了预期的写作目的。

第二档 (5—8分)

完成了部分试题规定的任务。

- •漏掉一些内容,但覆盖部分主要内容。
- 应用的语法结构和词汇能满足部分任务的要求。
- 有较多语法结构和词汇方面的错误,但对写作内容的理解影响不是很大,整体而言, 达到了部分预期的写作目的。

第一档 (1-4分)

未恰当完成试题规定的任务。

•漏掉或未描述清楚主要内容,写了一些无关内容。

- 语法结构单调、词汇项目有限。
- 有许多语法结构或词汇方面的错误,影响了对写作内容的理解。

信息未能清楚地传达给读者。

零分:

未能传达给读者任何信息:内容太少,无法评判;写的内容无关或所写内容无法看清。

- 1. 内容要点可用不同方式表达。
- 2. 对紧扣主题的适当发挥不予扣分。

第二节 读后续写评分标准

第五档 (21~25分)

- 创造了丰富、合理的内容,富有逻辑性,续写完整,与原文情境融洽度高。
- 使用了多样并且恰当的词汇和语法结构,表达流畅,可能有个别小错,但完全不影响理解。
 - 有效地使用了语句间衔接手段,全文结构清断,前后呼应,意义连贯。

第四档 (15~20分)

- 创造了比较丰富、合理的内容,比较有逻辑性,续写比较完整,与原文情境融治 度较高。
- 使用了比较多样并且怡当的词汇和语法结构,表达比较流畅,可能有些许错误,但不 影响理解。
 - 比较有效地使用了语句间衔接手段,全文结构比较清晰,意义比较连贯。

第三档 (9~14分)

- 创造了基本合理的内容,有一定的逻辑性,续写基本完整,与原文情境相关。
- 使用了简单的词汇和语法结构,有一些错误或不恰当之处,但基本不影响理解。
- 基本有效地使用了语句间衔接手段,全文结构基本清晰,意义基本连贯。

第二档 (5~8分)

- 内容或逻辑上有一些重大问题,续写不够完整,与原文情境有一定程度脱节:
- 所使用的词汇有限,语法结构单调,错误较多,且比较低级,影响理解;
- 未能有效地使用语句间衔接手段,全文结构不够消晰,意义不够连贯。

第一档 (1~4分)

- 内容或逻辑上有较多重大问题,或有部分内容抄自原文,续写不完整,与原文情境基本脱节。
 - 所使用的词汇有限,语法结构单调,错误很多,严重影响理解:
 - 几乎没有使用语句间衔接手段,全文结构不清晰,意义不连贯。

零分:
