The festive episode saw Rauch's Judge Abby Stone and Larroquette's Dan Fielding — whom he also played in the original series — dressing up as Santa Claus and an elf to avoid spoiling one little girl's Christmas.

Not Dead Yet

Gina Rodriguez is continuing her role as obituary writer Nell (讣告) Serrano, who discovers she can see the newly dead people about whom she's assigned to write. In its second season, which premieres on Jan. 2, *Not Dead Yet* is sure to come back with more hauntingly funny performances from the main cast and guest ghosts.

Grimsburg

Fox's new animated series, *Grimsburg*, was already renewed for a second season more than a year before its season 1 premiere on Jan. 7. Jon Hamm voices the sitcom's central character Marvin Flute, who is the leading detective in the fictional town of Grimsburg.

Hamm talked about his new role on *The Tonight Show*, explaining that while Marvin Flute isn't necessarily "living his best life", he is "very good at solving crimes".

Back in my childhood days, I lived in a small town that had a Carnegie library. Every week, without fail, I would make a visit to this library to borrow three books.

One of the most defining aspects of my life has been the challenge of living with a stammer ($\Box \not \vdash \Box$). It's a condition that can be incredibly burdensome and distressing, particularly if you happen to be a teenager. However, it turned out to be beneficial in shaping me into a female writer in my later life.

Because of my stammer, the library became my favorite place. To me, it was more than just a building; it was a shelter where I could escape into the pages of countless stories and communicate with the world without the fear of being judged. Without distraction from the outside world, I eagerly absorbed knowledge about various subjects, from science fiction to history, from biographies to poetry. Each book was a stepping stone, leading me further into the vast ocean of knowledge and imagination.

As I grew older, my love for reading evolved into a passion for writing. I began to pen my own stories. My stammer, which had once been a source of frustration, became a catalyst (催化剂) for creativity. It forced me to choose my words carefully, to think before I spoke, and to write with intention.

The library, with its endless rows of books and the quiet hum of other readers, was my classroom. It taught me that stories have the power to change lives, to transport us to different worlds, and to help us understand ourselves and others. It was there, in that small town library, that I discovered the writer within me. And it was that discovery that shaped my future, leading me to a career where I could share my own stories and, hopefully, inspire others as I had been inspired.

The country's increasing adoption of smart technologies in food production was recently showcased at an annual fair in Yangling, Shaanxi province, which featured a range of agricultural innovations focused on improving productivity.

Among those displayed at the 31st China Yangling Agricultural High-tech Fair included a digital irrigation (灌溉) system designed to improve water efficiency. The system has helped Shaanxi province, a major wheat production area, <u>curb</u> agricultural water usage by about 18 million cubic meters each year and cut electricity consumption by 20 million kilowatt-hours.

Drones designed for monitoring orchards situated in mountainous regions, along with tablets that allow for remote control of fertilization (施肥) during crop watering, are also attracting significant attention from fair visitors.

At the booth of Raintech, an agricultural startup in Beijing, a range of instruments were on display, including a mini-meteorological station capable of monitoring (监控) greenhouse environment and sending real-time data, such as temperature, to a smartphone app.

"The sensors integrated into the device can also monitor humidity, light intensity, atmospheric pressure and carbon dioxide levels," said Liu Hongtao, manager of the company.

By analyzing this data using AI-driven algorithms, the system can predict nighttime temperatures and alert growers to potential frost damage.

This innovation — coupled with other devices aimed at automating greenhouse environmental control, such as a supplementary lighting system — significantly benefits the advancement of facility agriculture.

This sector has strict light and temperature requirements during both day and night, making environmental control technologies essential for optimum production.

Data from the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Affairs showed that, currently, 2.67 million hectares of crops are grown in greenhouses in China.

Greenhouse farming also plays an important role in the production of animal protein, with 70 percent of the country's meat, eggs and milk and 52 percent of aquatic products relying on this method of cultivation.

Britain is facing a future of increasingly disastrous marine (海洋的) heatwaves that could destroy shellfish groups and fisheries (渔业) and have serious impacts on communities around the coast of the UK.

That is the conclusion of a new report by the National Oceanography Centre (NOC), which is pressing for the launch of a targeted research programme to investigate how sudden temperature rises in coastal seawater could affect marine habitats and seafood production in the UK.

"Marine heatwaves have catastrophic impacts and we need to be prepared for them. At present, we are not and that position needs to be rectified (修正) as a matter of urgency," said Dr Zoe Jacobs, the lead researcher at the NOC report.

"We need to know how these marine heatwaves are going to affect plants and animals that live in the sea and find ways to protect them, as well as the coastal communities that depend on them." In early summer 2023 Britain was struck by a marine heatwave in which major rises in the temperature of sea water were experienced off the north-east coast of England and off the west of Ireland.

For more than two weeks, the sea in these regions was around five degrees above normal temperatures, breaking records for late spring and early summer. And the North Sea and north Atlantic experienced higher temperatures at the same time, with sea temperatures reaching an all-time high, according to records that date back to 1850.

As global temperature continues to rise, scientists believe it is unavoidable that many more of these record-breaking heatwaves will affect water around Britain and Ireland in the near future. Now the problem is that the long-term consequences of such jumps in temperature are still unknown. "There have been stories that there were widespread die-offs of shellfish such as whelks, and disruption to many fisheries during last year's heatwave, but there is no hard evidence to back up these because we have not carried out any detailed research into the exact effects, and that is a problem."

Health Benefits of Rollerblading (滑旱冰)

Rollerblading is a popular sport nowadays. <u>36</u>. These activities require a combination of balance, coordination, and physical fitness, making the sport an excellent form of cardiovascular exercise (有氧运动). Here are some health benefits of rollerblading according to doctors.

Keep bones healthy

As the aging process progresses, bones tend to lose their definition and density. Rollerblading is a form of exercise that can reduce the risk of osteoporosis (骨质疏松). "Unlike running and other high-impact activities, rollerblading reduces the stress on your knees and ankles. ___37__." Says Florence Comite, MD, founder of the Comite Center for Precision Medicine & Health.

Rollerblading requires use of an individual's core muscles to keep them upright and balanced. "Rollerblading uses a greater side-to-side striding motion," Dr. Comite says. "It requires using your arms and balancing which involves your core muscle to stabilize your spine." A recent research also found that exercises such as rollerblading and roller-skating have been shown to improve balance among older adults.

Burn calories

Not only is rollerblading fun, but it can also burn a lot of calories in a short period of time. According to Harvard Medical School, an individual can burn upwards of 600 calories per hour when rollerblading. __39__.
